



A Spotlight on Summer Youth Programs

Summer 2024 was once again a success for BronxWorks summer youth programming! BronxWorks is committed to offering programming for children and youth that keep them fulfilled and challenged during their summer break. Younger participants engage in both recreational and educational activities to continue their learning throughout the year. Older youth have opportunities to gain employment experience and workplace development skills as they enter adulthood.



Summer Youth Employment Program BronxWorks once again partnered with the NYC Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD) to offer the Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP). This year, we connected over 1,300 Bronx youth ages 14-24 with career exploration opportunities varying by age. Older youth (16-24) were placed in over 100 worksites and gained real-world work experience in fields such as finance, operations, marketing, hospitality, and more. Younger youth (14-15) were placed in BronxWorks project-based learning groups that focused on developing workforce skills and finding their passions. Both groups earned paid work experience for six weeks and benefitted from career exploration activities, workforce development workshops, and other unique opportunities.

SYEP participants also contributed to developing a curriculum about financial education through Money Moves: A Youth Forum. The forum was hosted by the BronxWorks Financial Empowerment Center in partnership with JPMorgan Chase and Citizens Bank. Through a series of workshops, participants learned about financial literacy, covering topics such as budgeting, banking, and planning for the future.



Summer Rising

Also in partnership with DYCD, BronxWorks Summer Camp programs implemented the Summer Rising Initiative. The initiative is an approach at replacing conventional summer school by offering a school-centered program accessible to all NYC K-8 students. Summer Rising included a mix of academic support, social-emotional growth, and enriching recreational activities. This initiative seamlessly blended a summer camp environment with educational instruction aimed at bridging learning gaps in between the school years.

Aquatics

BronxWorks youth of all ages were back in the pool! Participants from our elementary and middle school summer camp programs were thrilled to swim in the BronxWorks Indoor Pool. The children played fun water games and also benefitted from guided instruction to learn valuable swimming skills. Teens from the Pyramid Cornerstone Community Center also had the opportunity to enjoy the pool and beat the heat this summer.

Additionally, some middle school participants came together to form the Boogie Down Swimmers. This group utilized the BronxWorks pool to engage in water safety lessons with instructors twice a week. They developed strong bonds as they worked in a team-like atmosphere to improve their aquatic skills.





We wish all of our summer participants a great rest of the summer and we look forward to seeing them in the upcoming school year!
