



Scott Auwarter, Assistant Executive Director, Retires After a Groundbreaking Career with BronxWorks



Scott Auwarter joined BronxWorks in the mid 1980s as a student intern and became a full-time staff member shortly after. He continued to rise through the ranks and became the Assistant Executive Director for Case Management Programs in 2002. Scott has held this position for over two decades, overseeing street homeless services, family shelters, HIV/AIDS services, and foster care prevention programs.

During his career at BronxWorks, Scott helped lead the organization to play a critical role in dramatically reducing street homelessness throughout the borough. In 1995 he established our Homeless Outreach Team, the first of its kind, in partnership with the New York City Department of Homeless Services. Scott also spearheaded the development of a continuum of care for homeless individuals within the organization. Because of Scott's leadership, BronxWorks now offers an array of programs to support unhoused individuals throughout their progress to re-stabilization, including street outreach, a drop-in center, shelters, safe havens, chronic health care, supportive housing, and more. He is a strong advocate for the Housing First model, an approach which prioritizes obtaining stable housing before addressing an individual's other

challenges. Scott strives to ensure that the most vulnerable in our community are treated with the utmost dignity and provided with the necessary resources to reestablish themselves.

Scott's many years of experience in developing homeless services has made him widely recognized as an expert in the field, and his work has left a long-lasting impact upon the Bronx community. BronxWorks is incredibly grateful to Scott for his unwavering passion and hard work to lift lives and build futures in the Bronx.

BronxWorks Safe Haven Provides Narcan Training

BronxWorks Pyramid Safe Haven recognized Opioid Overdose Awareness Day on August 31 with a week of events aimed to educate participants on the signs and causes of overdose. BronxWorks staff and Safe Haven residents had the opportunity to participate in events such as Health & Wellness Education sessions, a Resource Fair, and Narcan Training. Narcan is a medicine that can treat an overdose in an emergency situation, and all Safe Haven residents are trained to administer Narcan within two

weeks of moving in. One resident shared that the training has been extremely valuable as he has been in situations where Narcan was necessary.





BronxWorks Board Retreat

The BronxWorks Board of Directors recently came together for their annual Board Retreat! Board members and staff convened at Bronx Point, a multi-use development opened in 2023 that is now home to several BronxWorks programs. The Board of Directors and executive staff meet for a full-day retreat every year to discuss long term plans and strategy for the future of the organization.


