Even as a child, Sheila Rodriguez, MBA, was troubled by the fact that people in her community lived without homes or enough food. She knew from an early age that she wanted to work towards real change for her neighbors. Raised in the Bronx for most of her childhood, Sheila first learned the importance of community from her family. Her parents would often go out of their way to support those in need however they could. Her family's generous actions and values instilled in Sheila a strong sense of compassion and care for others



that has remained with her to this day. Sheila now supports families as they transition out of shelter and into long-term housing as the Case Manager of the Transform program.

"I strive to make each client feel seen, respected, and understood. I want them to know that their individual journey matters. It's incredibly rewarding to work alongside someone, offering guidance and assistance, and to ultimately see them emerge with hope for a brighter future."


# **Summer Youth Employment Program Jobsite Fairs**
