







New and Exciting Updates at BronxWorks

We are excited to share some new changes the organization has gone through recently! Throughout our history, BronxWorks has continuously implemented new programs, locations, and structures to better support the community. We opened a brand new location in the Bronx dedicated to our Tenant Defense Program. Additionally, BronxWorks Train & Earn, a workforce development program assisting young adults start a career in healthcare, is celebrating the first cohort's completion of the program. BronxWorks has also recently welcomed new senior leadership who have taken on key positions. We are proud of our continued commitment to meet the evolving needs of our neighbors.

Train and Earn Program

The first cohort of the BronxWorks Train & Earn program have completed their internships! Train & Earn is a workforce development program for

young adults who are eager to start or advance their careers in community healthcare. The program, provided in partnership with the NYC Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD), supports adults 18-24 years old who are unemployed and not currently enrolled in college. Participants train to become a Certified Clinical Medical Assistant and earn valuable industry certifications. The six-month program includes career development workshops, financial coaching, 12 weeks of medical theory and hands-on training, and a 150-hour paid internship.

By the end of the program, the participants have the skills and experience to enter the healthcare industry and pursue the next steps in their careers. Participants receive individual assistance from a BronxWorks Job Developer to find employment in the field, apply for college, or begin other advanced training.

The Tenant Defense Program Office Is Now Open!

BronxWorks is excited for the opening of our newest location, an office dedicated to our Tenant Defense Program! In October of 2024, BronxWorks expanded our Legal Services department to include a Tenant Defense Program, offering Right to Counsel services to the Bronx. Universal Access to Counsel is a New York City initiative introduced in 2017 that ensures the right to free legal representation for low-income New Yorkers facing eviction in housing court.

The Tenant Defense Program, comprised of over a dozen attorneys and support staff, will work out of the new office at 818 River Avenue in the Bronx. This site is located in a green-energy, mixed-use development in the midst of the 161st Street commercial corridor. Other BronxWorks legal department services, including Immigration, Crime Victims, and Domestic Violence, continue to work out of BronxWorks offices throughout the community. Since opening our doors in 1972, BronxWorks has supported our community members facing housing instability, and the Tenant Defense Program is the newest of many programs at the organization providing eviction prevention services to the Bronx.

BronxWorks Senior Staff Retreat



BronxWorks Cooling Centers

The BronxWorks Classic Cornerstone Community Center and BronxWorks Director of Quality & Compliance Amanda Perez recently featured in a public service announcement by the Bronx Borough President's office about NYC Cooling Centers! When temperatures reach dangerous levels, New York City declares a Code Red and opens designated cooling centers across the city. Several BronxWorks sites operate as cooling centers during a Code Red and have helped thousands of our Bronx neighbors stay cool during heat waves throughout the summer.
